If I'm planning on getting my Bachelor's Degree, why bother claiming my Associate's Degree?

It's a given that most people *plan* on getting their bachelors degree when they transfer from BMCC to EOU, but sometimes things happen that can prevent students from completing their bachelor's degree. An unplanned pregnancy, serious illness or injury to yourself or family member, or a general lack of funds may make completing college a serious hardship. If one of these, or any number of roadblocks occur during your degree pursuit and causes you to quit school, you will have nothing to show on your resume. *Unless, of course, you get your associate's degree from BMCC.*
