University of Missouri

- Land grant institution
- Research intensive/AAU
- Middle of Missouri in Columbia, population 108,5000
- Total Enrollment: 35,441
 - In-state: 24,586 (69.4 percent)
 - Out-of-state: 10,855 (30.6 percent)
 - Undergraduate: 27,654 (78 percent)
 - Graduate: 6,565 (18.5 percent)
 - Professional: 1,222 (3.4 percent includes Medicine, Vet. Med and Law)



MISSOURI REVERSE TRANSFER seamless associate degree completion

Background

- HB 1042 of 2012 required CBHE to develop a policy to foster reverse transfer
- MDHE secured \$500,000 Lumina and Kresge Foundation grant to implement Missouri Reverse Transfer Initiative (MRTI)
- MRTI Steering Committee named by MDHE based upon campus nominations
- MDHE anticipated three phases of implementation and set the committee's charge



Phases of Missouri Reverse Transfer

- Project had to roll out by Fall 2014 to meet Lumina and State statue requirements:
 - Phase I new transfers for the Fall 2014 semester
 - Phase II currently enrolled students not previously contacted; initiated Spring 2015.
 - Phase III students not currently enrolled meeting the eligibility criteria; Fall 2015



Current Process

- Bring all campuses up to technical ability to create a "locked" PDF via ETX into NSC drop box
- Piloted to prove technically we could handle exchanges this way
- Allows exchanges within the state only
- PDFs must be downloaded and entered (by hand) into two-year school's system
- ▶ Total institutions 42, includes 2 yr., 4 yr., public and independent



New NSC Process - Benefits

- Will allow us to exchange across state lines
- Time saved with matching files
- Will allow institutions that have capabilities to "ingest" the file into their system to run audits
- Reports available in one place with updated information
- Effort to set up files is limited, a few hours in most cases
 - Skill set not complicated
 - Most institutions already feed file to the NSC



New NSC Process - Challenges

- Getting Missouri institutions to switch process now that they are using the PDF
- Learning curve for new process
- Setting up agreements with institutions outside the state
- Possibly run two processes while we transition
- Re-programming efforts
- Adding a new address type
- Testing for all the campuses



Missouri Committee on Transfer and Articulation (COTA)

- Effective January 2015, COTA assumed the permanent oversight of the Missouri Reverse Transfer Program
- COTA will continue to provide the support
 - Need to begin to communicate new option post July 1
 - More RT Coordinator meetings to explain
 - No more grant funding to pay for travel, etc. for institutions
