State Associate's Degree Attainment: The Potential of Reverse Transfer

National data show that the majority of students who transfer from a community college to a 4-year college or university do so without an associate's degree (Hoachlander, Sikora, & Horn, 2003), and the many of these students never make it to the bachelor's degree (Shapiro, et al., 2013). Yet, many of these students earned the credits needed for an associate's degree. The Credit When It's Due (CWID) initiative is focused on developing reverse transfer programs and policies to

confer transfer students associate's degrees when they meet the degree requirements. The primary beneficiaries of the reverse transfer policies are students; these students have completed the credits needed for an associate's degree similar to students who complete the associate's degree prior to transfer. <u>Read more.</u>
