## **Project Profile: Health Professions Pathways (H2P) Evaluation**

#### **Overview**

The Healthcare Professions Pathways (H2P) Consortium is funded by the United States Department of Labor's Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT) grant. The H2P Consortium includes community colleges, workforce and community agencies, partner employers, and other stakeholders who seek to improve health professions education and training that leads to credential attainment. The Office of Community College Research and Leadership (OCCRL) is implementing the external evaluation for the H2P Consortium, including conducting an implementation study, supporting quarterly and annual reporting, conducting a quasi-experimental study, and facilitating the use of data for continuous improvement.

#### Goals

- Assess the implementation of core strategies that are aligned with the H2P Consortium's "transformational change" model;
- Provide regular review of the H2P Consortium's measures, which provides the basis for capacity building and dissemination of the national curriculum model.
- Support accurate and timely analysis and delivery of the quarterly and annual performance reports;
- Conduct a quasi-experimental evaluation, including assessing outcomes for H2P participants and comparison student cohorts; and
- Facilitate H2P Consortium member colleges' use of a continuous improvement model (<u>Pathways to Results</u>) to support program of study (POS) implementation, scale-up, and sustainability.
